George Manners (att<sup>y</sup> request of Edw: Almon Deceased) sayth that he may well knoweth y<sup>e</sup> Bull now claymed by Tho: Baker, as a gift unto him from Walter Cuthbert, about y<sup>e</sup> beginning of y<sup>e</sup> Rebellion in this countie. And y<sup>e</sup> to his knowledge it was a calfe of a 3 tetter Cow, w<sup>ch</sup> he credibly heard, & verily beleived to be a Cow plundered from Edw: Almon, in y<sup>e</sup> time of y<sup>e</sup> rebels here, by one Rich: Hobin. And further he beareth his knowledge of y<sup>e</sup> Bull, claymed as afore sayd during y<sup>e</sup> Rebel<sup>l</sup> here this Dep<sup>t</sup> bought both y<sup>e</sup> 3 tetter Cow, & this here calfe, of y<sup>e</sup> Rich: Hobin, betwixen Michaelmas & Christmas in y<sup>e</sup> year 1646. The 1<sup>st</sup> calfe, being calved about Feb: or march afore. Coloured dark brown w<sup>th</sup> a bright left downe of backe, a white star in y<sup>e</sup> forehead, somewhat white under y<sup>e</sup> belly, & tagged tagged. Ear marked att y<sup>e</sup> time y<sup>e</sup> this Dep<sup>t</sup> bought y<sup>e</sup> Bull, w<sup>th</sup> one ear under keele, the other having a small piece taken of slitting from under y<sup>e</sup> ear. The w<sup>ch</sup> after hee this Dep<sup>t</sup> altered as followeth. The ear under keele hee altered outt att all: of y<sup>e</sup> other hee enlarged y<sup>e</sup> piece taken from under y<sup>e</sup> ear, making it another underkeele, only he left it, towards y<sup>e</sup> rooke of y<sup>e</sup> ear w<sup>th</sup> an Notch in like a little fork, w<sup>th</sup> a square piece taken from over y<sup>e</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> ear. And further hee sayth not.
