 out of the County. The Court not being having evidence ready in Court to prove
 concerning the exportation of the forest. Boston's estate begins respice in the part
 which was granted in January next. And the Jury going in the other
 part of the demand returned their verdict in writing. They found for the p^l.
 1175. To be paid to the p^l. & the Court commanded it to be carried for the judgment.

 further he sayth, that it seemed then to him that both eaves were wrong.

Walter Beane being demanded upon oath, sayth that the Beasts which are now
 claimed by the p^l. was new marked or altered from the mark then now
 held by himself, or by any other through his appointment. And
 The Jury brought in Verdict. Was found for the def^t. And the Court did
 the def^t. as the out day.
