This Indenture made between the Queen of S. Maria, on the one part of Mary-Land Esq<sup>r</sup> on the one part & Hannah Markewes of the same place on the other part. The Queen his wages & assignees, of full & just summe of full whole years, beginning at Christmas next, after the date hereof, in all such services & employments as he shall see fit. The Queen his wages or assignees shall employ her in, according to the custom of the Country, in the like kind. In consideration whereof the Queen his wages or assignees, is to find for the said Hannah, so sufficient meate, drink, lodging, & cloathing during the term of her said service. & at the end of her said term of service, the Queen his wages or assignees, is to give her fifty shillings of Lawd, & one years provision, according to the custom of the Country. In witness whereof we have hereunto interchangeably set our hands & seals this 25<sup>th</sup> day of April 1647.

The Condition of this Indenture is such that if the said Hannah Markewes pay or cause to be paid unto our said part on S. Georges River one thousand weight of good march, choicable last of Feb. & cash, & three burrells of good Corn unto the Queen of the said Mary-Land Esq<sup>r</sup> his wages or assignees at or before the 25<sup>th</sup> day of Decemb<sup>r</sup> next after the date hereof, then the said Indenture shall be void, & to no effect, & the said Hannah acquitted from all obligation of service, then already made or agreed for to our by Indenture, being two whole years & three quarters, & from such other damages, as I might justly pretend against her, for her unlawfull affecting her selfe, from her said service, these two years. And if the said last of Feb. & cash & Corn, or any part thereof, be not truly & rightly paid in kind, & manner aforesaid, then the said Indenture shall remaine in full force & vigour. Reteyning us, unto our selfe, my wages & assignees, so much right & lyke on her said service, due by Indenture, as aforesaid. That the said Hannah shall not dispose of her selfe in marriage, or any wayes departe the Country without my knowledge, & consent, betweene this & the 25<sup>th</sup> of Decemb<sup>r</sup> next.
