 Kent, sold unto Henry Poulney, & to his heirs & Assignes for ever. All of Townsh<sup>sh</sup> of  
 Land, commonly called John Merton's plantation in Trinity Creek, & being in Trinity  
 manor in County of 1<sup>st</sup> Mary, in Maryland, in estimation & layd out for Ninety  
 acres of Land Together w<sup>th</sup> all edifices & all rights w<sup>ch</sup> were thereto appertaining  
 for 5<sup>th</sup> summe of nine hund<sup>rd</sup> & fifty pounds of Tob<sup>acco</sup> & cash for w<sup>ch</sup> I have already  
 received satisfaction. Hereof Henry Poulney yearly & paying yearly six  
 bushells of good merch<sup>ant</sup> wine to the Land or owner of the said Trinity manor on  
 the feast day of the Nativity of St. Land. & doing suite & performing service at every  
 Court holden of the said Trinity manor. And I do hereby warrant the sale of  
 & all other rights belonging thereto to him Henry Poulney, his heirs & Assignes  
 against any party claiming w<sup>ch</sup> contrary witness my hand this 9<sup>th</sup> of Feb. 1646.
