patched letters to Cap: William Fuller & Mr Richard Pres-  
ton &c desiring them to give him Mr Rich Secretary &  
Captaine Thomas Corntaleys a meeting at S<sup>t</sup> Leonards Creek  
in Patuxent River upon 18<sup>th</sup> of March following in order  
to the Performance of Articles ut supra, wch they sent with  
the aforesaid letters.

At a Councell held at S<sup>t</sup> Leonards 18<sup>th</sup> Martij Present The Lieutenant } Cap: Thomas Corntaleys

Wind & weather not permitting Cap: Fuller & the rest to com at  
the appointed time it was resolved that the Councell stay till  
saturday the 28<sup>th</sup> of March.

Martyj 20<sup>th</sup> Cap: William Fuller Mr Richard Preston Mr Edward Lloyd Mr Thomas  
Phears Mr Philip Thomas & Mr Samuel Withers came to S<sup>t</sup> Leonards  
in order to the performance of Articles & Surrender of the Govern-  
ment, butt the day being farre spent & Sunday not fit to treatise of  
busynesse all further treatise was putt off till monday the 22<sup>th</sup>.  
The Lieutenant read The Articles of Agreement betweyne the  
Right hon: the Lord Baltimore & Richard Bennett Esq: ut supra  
& demanded the Records, Great Seale, & the whole Government  
to be resigned up into his hands, & in the Name of the Lord Pro-  
prietor promised a ratification of those Articles then present  
under the Great Seale of the Province.  
Whereupon were Read his Maj: Instructions as followith viz

Instructions directed by the Right Hon: the Cecilius Abso-  
lute Lord & Proprietor of the Province of Maryland and  
Master in Law before the Lord Baltimore &c: To his Lordships Lieut-  
enant Lord Baltimore & his Council of the said Province  
of Maryland for the time being.
