According to the Warrant bearing date 22th Instant Tho-
mas Thurston was brought before the Governor, & the
said Thurston being desirous to depart the Province
the Govern^r ordered this following Warrant to be drawn
Whereas Thomas Thurston by himselfe & friends hath
desir'd of me that he may passe up to Annapundell, from
whence he hath engaged himselfe to depart this Province
by Monday next being the second day of August, untill
whos departing out of this Province Josias Cole is to rema-
ine as by Order of Court provided These are therefore in
the Lord Proprietarys name to Will^{ts} require you not to
molest the said Thomas Thurston during the time li-
mitid for his stay and so soone as he shall signify to you
his intencion presently to depart that you lett at liberty
the said Josias Cole provided that if they or either of
them shall be found within this Province after the afore-
said second day of August (unless made unable to de-
part by sickness) they or either of them be apprehended
and proceeded against according to lawe in their case pro-
vided Given Under my hand at Patuxent this 25th
of July 1658.
