

Cecillius absolute Lord and Proprietary of Maryland and the  
 low Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. To our Right Trusty and  
 well beloved our Lieutenant of Maryland for the time being  
 And to the best of our Council and other Officers Military  
 or Civil there greeting Wheras Captain James Neale  
 hath formerly bene an Inhabitant in Maryland, but upon  
 certaine occasions of his owne hath bene absent some  
 yeares from thence; and is now desirous to returne thither  
 againe with his family there to reside Knowe you that  
 Wee doe hereby give him free liberty there to inhabit and  
 to possess any such lands as he hath right unto or lawfully  
 fully claimes there paying the Rents and arrears of  
 Rent due to us for the same. And Moreover Wee doe  
 hereby give him free liberty to enter into any of our Ports  
 there; and there freely to trade by himselfe or his Agent or  
 Agents with any ship or ships which hee may buy or pro-  
 cure for trading in those parts. Provided that at his or  
 their arrivall there hee or they appear to you our said  
 Lieutenant, and there Register his said ship or ships and Mates  
 belonging to that Province. And that the said Captain  
 James Neale or his Agent or Attorney pay such Duties as  
 others usually pay for soe trading there And provided also  
 so that hee or his Agents do not trade with any Indian or  
 Indians in or through our said Province without licence first  
 obtained for the same from you our said Lieutenant upon  
 such termes and conditions as others pay and performe for  
 such trading, And by willing and requiring you our said Lieut-  
 enant and Council and all other our Officers Military or  
 Civill within our said Province well and truly to observe  
 and obey this our warrant and Comaund in admitting and  
 protecting the said James Neale or his lawfull Agent or Agents  
 in any lawfull Act or thing which they or any of them shall  
 doe in pursuance of the premises contained in this our war-  
 rant Given under our hand and greater Seale at Charles  
 this Nynth day of January in the Eight and twentieth  
 yeare of our Dominion over the said Province of Maryland  
 And in the yeare of our Lord God 1659.
