Sheweth That whereas Capt^t John Norwood late Sheriffe
of Ann Arundell County hath taken away from your

when in truth he was never summoned thereunto by
any officer nor had knowledge thereof as may app^r
by the Sold^{rs} denying any part ^{of the said}, yet they knowing
it to be unjustly taken he not refusing beyond his Son
to the place of Military Exercise whensoever sum-
moned thereunto

May it therefore please yo^r hono^r, that seeing the Soldi^{ers} willing
not to remitt, their parts of the fyne your hono^r would be grati-
ously pleased to remitt yours and that andred, & to that effect may be
sent from your Honno^r, unto the sayd Capt^t Norwood to deliver the
said Cattle againe in your pet^r husband hand and your petitor as
in duty bound shall pray
