 And that before them you take your Oath belonging to
 the Sheriff as is to you sworn as aforesaid, and give bond
 likewise as is prescribed by Act of Assembly in that
 behalf, and that you upon your said Oath give
 belonging to your Office of Sheriff without further
 delay, And also that you said Comm^r and require
 to administer Oath to the said John Curriell upon
 his being received as Clarke of your Court, after
 you cause him the said Curriell to send down to
 the Lieutenant Generall and Council what you
 he may his Certificate of the Proceedings herein
 shall and my hand this 17th day of May 1665
