Mr Francis Wright of Baltimore County being sent by the Susque-
-hannocks to the Governour and Council was called in, who
declared that the said Indians did require assistance & ammunition
from the Council sufficient to god ag^t any Indian Enemy
likewise declared Enemy to the inhabitants of this province
according to one of the Articles of the agreement and peace made
by the English to the said Susquehannocks,

Whereupon ordered that so many men as well as the Susque-
-hannocks shall require to their aids and assistance and that
them up forthwith

Also that a quantity of powder be delivered unto Mr Francis
Wright and the said Indians to be supplied out of the same
as the said Wright shall see requisite and convenient

The Governour and Council hath further determined to
god up into Baltimore County and there to give the Susquehannocks
a meeting about the 15th day of September next
to treat wth the said Indians about the peace and safety
of this province, how to proceed (with the said Susquehannocks
assistance) ag^t any Indians now held and declared Enemy to
this province
