the trustees of each ship and his agents you are my
and am liable in respect to my debts for all such
trustees as are named, or by the authority of the master

Hastily You are to instruct William Cooke how to keep a book
of entry of all such ships and the just and full value in Pounds
and pence and when after night go to Middlebury to take an
account of the same to be made by the said Cooke and the sum
you are to charge into the account book which you are to keep
that so I may send the bill of lading and fair and full benefit
by you till 1008

Hastily You are required to get the books of the trustees for rea-
sonable time the second half of the annual and respective
accounts may have the master ship returning that you give
Hester to the said Master and the year and account of my ship
him and due to my master Mr. Thomas Holley to be dis-
posed of by the said Holley as he shall direct

Hastily You are impowered to take the proof of all such receipts
for land as shall be offered by any person under writing him fit of
his shipper's and owner's signature thereby regulating your
admit of no other witness but of the master among them who
was such freighter originally due to him as also no other
transacted by or committed to him that shall demand benefit
of the condition of payment of the same you
must take a general sum from time to time

Hastily You must be careful to delay no man when his freight
ought to be done and suffer not the clock under your watch
to languish by going away from under the fire especially if it may
so offend you that bring plaints upon such inferior persons
as may which have too lately passed muster
