all such commandants and masters of ships sent over to us  
Coming into these ports to trade and for payment of certificate  
from some Master here in England of bond given there and  
to see that William Brooks do receive the same and understand  
that Captain will give such bond satisfactorily you & the said  
Brooks of such commandants and Masters as you send to be sent as  
I shall hereafter direct and command.

Thirdly. You are impowered to sign the letters of the commandants  
to take the signature of will and by him to command to appear before  
not failing at the signing of such letters by due course and ap-  
pointment of the Honble Charles Calvert Esq<sup>r</sup>

Fourthly. Then you are required to cause all such commandants  
and Masters as you send to give bond with sufficient instalments  
of their service for the payment of his pay until that the sum  
of this place do require from them the sum of one hundred and  
fifty pounds from M<sup>rs</sup> H<sup>r</sup> Holley given under my hand the  
seventeenth day of May in the thousand six hundred and sixty nine.
