

Mind that on the 15th day of December 1699 the abovesaid
Samuel Chevall^{ig} took the Oath before his Lordships Council
January the 4th 1699

Upon information given by Daniel Jenifer Gent
unto William Calvert Esq one of his Lordships Clerks counsel
that James Ciston of Wigton give bring within the Province
to will the second day of January next month at Lancaster
the City of St Marys within the said County of Lancaster
treacherously after published and declared words of Concer-
ning and Against the Majesty and Person of our Royal so-
vereign King Charles the second King of England &c & that
the King was a son of all threid and twome thousand
pounds and no more than nowe he would

Thereupon it was commanded him that he take
the City of the said James Ciston and him to bring before the
said William Calvert or some one of his Lordships Clerks
at Lancaster the present

Afterwards on the fifth day of the same month
of January in the year aforesaid before Philip Calvert Esq
William Calvert Esq before his Lordships Clerks counsel
said James Ciston in the Custody of the said John Kielie
and the said Daniel Jenifer like wise said the said Daniel Jenifer
that he was informed by Abraham Alcock and Walter Lane
that the said James Ciston had spoken the abovesaid words
against the King. They by reason of his standell accused and
& Walter Lane appearing being sworn upon their Oaths say Abraham Alcock
the said Abraham Alcock held that being in company with
Mr Ciston on Saturday last among several others there was
some quarrelling but he never heard Mr Ciston speak any
thing against the King of England in his life and further de-
pined that he did not hear the said Ciston speak these words
viz. that the King was a son of a whore and owned her
