

Lastly from the miserable Poor they desire that hereafter when their Nation may be reduced to nothing perhaps they may not be Seized and Thrused out of our Protection

To which was answered by the Deputy Lieutenants that as they desired to continue in Amity with us so did we assure them that we should not break the Articles made & Confirmed by Act of Assembly between the Lord Proprietary and them and that we do hope they will be mindful and wary to preserve every of the said Articles and that so long we should not scorn or Cast off the means of them

Was then moved by the Deputy Lieutenants to have the Indian that stroke Benjamin Price delivered there being a Great doubt that the said Place did of the Blow to which they replied that Place did not of the Blow but was in health twenty days after and that the said Place was swimming and diving in the presence of Mr Chardlers Children de Port Tobacco and came out of the water sick of a Nettle and vomited and of the said sickness which upon the Deputy Lieutenants desired to speak with the Emperour the last day of October together with his Council at S<sup>t</sup> Marys

To which the Speaker answered the Emperour was at the Susquehanna roughs and that it was not in his power to promise that he should come but for Clearing the Business desired the board might be searched

Wherupon it is intred that John Standley and John Pine Cheryngers do give the board upon Monday the Eightth of August and that Monatquand be present and that the Cheryngers Certify what their opinions are touching the death of the said Place

Further intred that there be given to the said Monatquand and Annacasy of Shippasamough three Hatch Coats and two Gallons of Rum
