These are to Authouse and require you to call together this pres
 month of december four or more of the Commissioners of your
 County with the Clerk whom you are hereby required to impower
 to sit as a Court and during their sitting by virtue of your Office
 to make or cause to be made publick Proclamtion thereby gi
 ving notice to all the freemen of your said County who live within
 the said County visible seated plantations of fifty Acres of Land
 at the least or visible personal Estates to the Value of forty Pounds
