

Instructions from the right honble Cecilius Calvert
Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland and
Colonel Lord Brown of Baltimore &c

To his trusty and deare Beloued Captaine William Talbot
Esq: his chief Secular of his Lordships said Service of
Maryland

1 His Lordship doth hereby authorise and require you that
as often as you shall desire you and the Lieut General Chancellor
Council Councillors Judges Justices and all other his Lordships
Officers of the said Province in mind to observe and execute all
such former Instructions and Authorities as have been given
or shall from time to come by his Lordship unto them
humbly.....as soverain and to perform their duties
in their several and respective Offices and places of trust

2 That you be studious and carefull in examining the rights
of all planters of such as supply themselves who you to assert
their rights to Land and that you diligently weigh and con-
sider their allegations and unless you be very well satisfied of
the truth of them upon your own knowledge or something very
notorious that you do no give due proof to be made of them to
the end you may be fully satisfied that the same rights have
not been formerly allowed and made use of and that no rights
or conditions of plantation be allowed but to such have first
fights unto them his Lordship doth require you to make strict
search in relation to all such rights claimed before you make
any allowance of such rights

3 That you take care to enquire after the debts of Land and
Inheritances which he specified to his Lordship by any means
or mean whatsoever and the same to be entered upon
I record there that all such estates of forfeited Lands may
be violently taken and be known at first sight to be sequestrated
