


time to time to give advice and Councell concerning the said Sur-

S: the Honble Philip Calvert Esq: Chamberlaine of Maryland being
fully informed by the Honble Lieutenant General of Maryland
and Edmund Scarburgh his Majestys Surveyor General of Vir-
ginia after a full and perfect view taking of the point of Land
made by the North side of Pocomoke R: beyond South side of
Assawpeaks R: they have and do conclude the same to be Wal-
kins Flint from which said Flint so called we have run an
East Line agreeable with the eastward part of the Westmost
Angle of the said Harkins flint over smoake River to the
Land next to Col. Holdens and there have marked certain
Trees which are contained by an East Line running over smoake
R: and into the Marsh of the sea side with apparent
marks and Boundaries which by your mutual Agreement accor-
ding to the qualifications aforesaid are to be received as the Bounds
of Virginia and Maryland on the Eastern Shore of Chesapeake
Bay in confirmation of which Concurrence have set to our hands
and Seals this 25 day of June 1668
