We do find according to the best of our Judgments that the  
aforesaid Ship John of Heymouth have suffered much damage  
by the waves of this Country both in the ride as also in the  
Harbour. She is fit and ether suitable parts of the said ship  
so much that she is incapable of performing her intended  
voyage and whereas by the said warrant we were required  
to give the best of our Judgments as to what expenses may require  
her own Opinions is that she will not be sufficiently repaired  
and made capable to go home for Heymouth under the charge  
of five hundred pounds Sterling or thereabouts if they get con-  
veniences and workmen for the same which according to our  
Judgments will not be obtained in this Country and in  
Case such person or persons as aforesaid may be made and such charge  
defrayed on the aforesaid ship she being by us found to be very  
old and much decayed in the said parts thereof we do declare  
that we cannot justly say whether she may be capable of  
performing her intended voyage or howe farre she may be


