 that he shall employ to trade with the Indians, shall not vend  
 or sell to the said Indians for the purchasing the said Cow  
 Any powder arms or ammunition at their price till this License  
 to continue in force for six months and no longer Given under  
 my hand and seal at Annesbury 14<sup>th</sup> day of March 1672
