 shall enter and Clear as aforesaid. I hereby allowing you  
 for your labour and pains in the execution of the premises ten  
 Cent out of the Imposition money for duties and Secreta  
 ries fees given under my hand and Seal at Arms this five<sup>th</sup>  
 twentieth day of October in the two and fortieth year of the  
 Dominion of Charles the first King of Great Brittain One thousand six  
 hundred seventy three.
