shall transport out of this Province the said Ossatop alias Robin without the
express leave of the Governor of this Province under his hand & seal first had &
obtained at the or they will answer his Excellency at their perills and under the
penalty generally in the law against transporting free Indians out of this
Province provided and enacted.

Baronet in whose was yielded the former place of the Provincial Office of this Province
and for that his Lordship hath left the Disposall of his said place to me, I do hereby
Doubt authorise and empower Robert Ridgely to be Factor of his said Office and to be
Engager of the Rent of Planting during my absence, and the said Office to be entit-
led in as full and ample manner as any other Factor of his said Office here before used
Exempted the same, and to affe diverse and take all fees due thereby Regard-
lessong and appertaining to his said Office to the said Ridgely's own use without
being accountable for his same to any person from the tenth day of September last
until and during his time as he shall execute the same and for his so doing he
shall be sufficient warrant given and my hand and seal at answe this 25th
day of October in the 41st year of the Dominion of Charles or James the Second.
