Upon a motion of her hono: Baker Brooks Esq. Surveyor General of this Province
that in his lot of Officers for Surveyors there was no provision made what
any Surveyor should have for delivering any quantity of Land whereby the Deputy
Surveyors are left to their own liberty and take what they please to the great
opposition and inconveniences of Distrust of the Inhabitants of this Province his Excellency
and Council taking the same into their Consideration for Execution of the Law
concerning Surveyors for the sum of one hundred dollars per
Surveying any piece of land that shall contain One hundred and forty acres
or more and for any piece of land containing under One hundred and forty acres
the Surveyor shall demand and receive four hundred pounds of Tobacco for the
Surveying thereof and no more, and of all the other Deputy Surveyors within this
Province are to take notice at their galls and the Sheriff of each County is to
publish this and at his County Oct. and affix a copy hereof at the Court
House door of every District Court that the people and Surveyors of each
County having notice hereof the inconveniences which formerly happened upon
such occasions may be prevented.

*Instructions given by the Right Hon: George Lord Baltimore absolute Lord

Loyall Government of Maryland.*

His Loyall & Kirby authoriseth his said friends to suspend from time to time any of
his Officers or Council in Maryland of what Quality or Condition soe
they be from the Execution and profitts of their Officers Office or office —
from being of his Loyall Council if he find cause for the same to take
into his Loyall all such things as belong to any such office or office to —
dispossess the Execution and receiving of the proffits thereof as he shall —
think fit till upon notice given of his Loyall shall give other and thence —
any sufficient Instructions warrant or commandment given or granted
by his Loyall to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.
