

hereafter mentioned and aswell for the preservation of the peace in that part of the province as for the ease and benefit of the Inhabitants there or which shall hereafter inhabit there I doe hereby declare & publish that from the mouth of the Chesapeake River and so downe the eastern side of Chesapeake Bay to Swan point and from thence to the point and so up the River to the head thereof is hereby created into a County and called by the name of Swell County. And I doe hereby further declare that the Southern bounds of Baltimore County be the South side of Potapoco River and from the highest plantation on that side of the River due South two miles into the woods And that the north side of Potapoco River beginning at the north side of Long Creeke be adjoynd to Ann Arundell County - And that the Sheriffs of the severall respective Counties of Swell Baltimore Ann Arundell and Talbot make proclamation hereof in their said Counties respectively and immediately after proclamation dooys hereof offic at the Court house doors of their respective Counties In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and caused the lesser Seale of this Province to be hereunto affixed the sixth day of June in the 42th yeare of the Dominion of Charles or Annoys Dom 1674.

Know all men by these presents that I John Quigley of the City of St. Maries in the Province of Maryland Merchant doe confesse & acknowledge my selfe to owe and stand indebted unto the Hon^{ble} Charles Calvert Esq^r in the full and just summe or quantity of fifty thousand pounds of good sound merchantable Tobacco in casques to containe the said summe to be paid to the said Charles Calvert or to his certaine Attorney his heirs or assignes to the which payment well and truly to be made I bind my selfe my heirs executors and Administrators in the whole firmly by these presents Sealed with my Seale and Dated this sixth day of June in the two and fourtith yeare of the Dominion of Charles or Annoys Dom 1674.

The Condition of this present Obligation is such that whereas the said John Quigley hath undertaken to build a Statehouse and prison at the City of St. Maries upon the Land within the liberties of the said City according to the intent meaning & purport of an Act of Assembly made at a Sessions of Assembly held at the said City of St. Maries upon the twentieth day of May last past and there continued till the thirtieth day of June instant intituled An Act for the building a prison and Statehouse at St. Maries. It therefore the said John Quigley shall well and truly build and finish the said Statehouse and prison according to the severall Dimensions & proportion in the said Act mentioned within the time within the said Act limited & appointed
