

Boys and Luygours to Rendezvous upon Friday which will be the thirteenth and twentieth instant, at the head of Stiglic Bay from whence they shall continue their march to the North side of the mouth of Pascattaway Creek where they shall attend your Amiral and joyn with you where their Commanders will advise with you upon the wayes and means to prosecute the War against the Dages and Susquetanagh Indians till the death or satisfaction and all possible Satisfaction obtained from them for damages done to his Majties Subjects which is all at present (as we conceive) expected
 Your Humble Servants

It is now Major Thomas Parman Ordered and appointed to be Commander in this expedition, over the said forces to be raised as aforesaid.

Upon the Complaint of John Newton Merchant that One John Morris hath Offended and done him severall abuses, Ordered that the said John Morris shall Surety for the peace and appearance at the next Provinciall Court to answer the Complaint of the said Newton.

Then came the said John Morris & appeared upon himselfe upon paine of ten pounds Sterling and John Quigley Gent then & there likewise bound and did undertake for the said John Morris to pay upon paine of five pounds Ster that the said John Morris should personally appear before Rob Lopp Justice of the next Provinciall Court to be holden at the City of St Maries the 16th day of November next to doe and receive what shall by the Court then & there to him be assigned, and that he in the meane time keepe the peace towards Rob Lopp and all the good people of that Province and specially towards the said John Newton And that he shall not doe or procure or cause to be done any damage or disparageall hurt to the said John Newton or any the people of that Province or the disturbance of the peace of his Lopp the Lord Proprietary Which said Summe of ten pounds Ster the said John Morris and the said Summe of five pounds Ster the said Surety did acknowledge to owe to his said Lopp of their respective tenors & contents Goods & Chattells to the use of his said Lopp & his Successors to be made & levied if the said John Morris shall offend or breake any of the promises

Ordered That the Council meet here at Richard Keeses Upon Monday the seven and twentieth of this instant month of September.

 Ordered by the Governour and Council that the Inhabitants of the western and northern Branches of Petupent River and the weak Plantations next adjoining to them be immediately Drawne together to some place there which shall be thought most safe for them to inhabit in.
