The Council taking into consideration the merits of the King of Mattawomon vizt that he came first in to Major Truman voluntarily and offered all his men to serve us against the Susquehannocks and his women and children for hostages and for that he continued all the time of the War with the English and in the pursuit of the Enemy doe humbly desire the Governours concurrence to an Order that the said King of Mattawomon may be presented with twelve matchcoats as a mark of Our Gratitude and that he have the value of One hundred Armes length of Roanoke vizt four matchcoats

For every prisoner of the Susquehannocks they have taken and delivered the said matchcoats to be paid to the Indians that took the said prisoners And for what concerned the Pasquotaway Indians they likewise humbly desire that the said Indians may have four matchcoats delivered them for every prisoner they have delivered to be paid to the Indians that took them

Next Whereas the said King of Mattawomon desired to support himselfe for the security of himselfe and people against the Susquehannocks who are now his Enemies Only because he hath sponsored our quarrell against them The Council doe request that it may be ordered that he have liberty to infect himselfe with his people upon any place the Governour shall thinke fitt and that his signing of this request shall make this an Order of the Governour and Council
