If any number of Soldiers shall presume to assemble to take
Council amongst themselves for demanding their pay, any inferior
Officers accessory thereto shall suffer death for it, and the heads
and Ring leaders of such mutinous and Sedition meetings, and the
Soldiers shall be punished either with death or otherwise at
the discretion of his Royal Generall Court Marshall, and if
any Captain being party thereto shall not suppose the
Same or complain of it, he shall likewise be punished with
death or otherwise as the said Generall Court Martiall
shall think fit.

11th

No Officer or Soldier shall utter any words deniding or
Sedition Mutiny or Unpeace upon paine of suffering such
punishment as shall be inflicted on him by a Court Marshall
And whosoever shall hear any mutinous or Sedition words
spoken and shall not with all possible Speed reveal the
Same to his Superior Officers or Commanders shall be punished
as a Court Marshall shall think fit.

12^o

If any Inferior Officer or Soldier shall refuse to obey his Superior
Officer or shall quarrel with him, he shall be cashiered or suffer
such punishment as a Court Marshall shall think fit, but if
any Soldier shall presume to resist any Officer in the execution
of his Office or shall strike or lift up his hand or strike
or shall draw or offer to draw or lift up any weapon
against his Superior Officer upon any pretence whatsoever
he shall suffer death or other condigne punishment as a
Generall Court Marshall shall think fit.

13.

Every Soldier shall keep silence when the Army is marching
embatteling and taking up their Quarters (to the end that
their Officers may be heard and their Orders executed) upon
paine of imprisonment or such other punishment as a Court
Martiall shall think fit according to the circumstances and
aggravation of the fact.

14^o

He who shall in Anger draw his Sword whilst his colours
are flying either in Battle or upon the March without
it be against the Enemy shall suffer such punishment
as a Court Martiall shall think fit.

15^o

When any March is to be made every man who is fowrmed
shall follow his Colours and who ever shall (without
leave) stay behid or depart above a mile from the
Camp or out of the Army without Licence shall suffer
such punishment as shall be inflicted on him by a Courts
Martiall.

Where an Army or any part thereof shall march through this
Country or Lodge or Quarter in any Plantation or plantations
belonging to any Inhabitant or Inhabitants of this Province
None of them shall willingly or willingly committ any waste or Spoliation
