

of his Relict and Children (if any he leave behind him) for his Relict & widow during the time of her widow hood and for his Children during the time of their infancy or till such time they may be putt apprentices or come to years capable of getting their Own Livelihood. —

31.

All Captains shall use their utmost endeavours to have their Troops and Companies compleate and full, and within two days after every Generall Muster both the Captaine and Muster master shall send to the Generall if he requires it a perfect list or Roll of all the Officers Troopers and Soldiers of their Troops and Companies that are in actual Service, punctually expressing at the foot of the Rolls what new Officers Troopers and Soldiers have been entertained since the preceding Muster in case of such who have been cashiered or are deceased, with the day when one dyed or went of and the other was entertained in his place.

32.

His High the Lord Proprietary hath expressly forbidden any Soldiers duty to be done either of horse or foot by any other then the Soldier himselfe, but in case of sickness and disability or other necessary cause his Capt may dispence with his absence, without causing him to find another to serve in his stead. —

33.

If any Trooper or Dragoon shall lose or spoile his horse or any foot Soldiers his armes or any part thereof by negligence or gaming he shall remaine in the quality of a Pioneer or Scavenger till he be furnished with as good as were lost at his Owne charge, and if he be not otherwise able the One halfe of his pay shall be deducted and sett apart for the providing of it till it be refurnished neither shall any Soldier pawn or sell or negligently or wilfully breake his armes or any part thereof, or any Hatchets Spades Shovells pickaxes or other necessaryes of war, upon paine of severer punishment at the discretion of the Generall Court Martiall, And where armes or other necessaries aforesaid shall be provided they are to be furnished and seized on for his Highs use. —

34.

None shall presume to spoile sell or convey away any ammunition delivered unto him, upon paine of suffering death or such other punishment as the Generall Court Martiall shall thinke fitt. —

35.

None shall presume to spoile sell
Every Officer Provider or keeper of Victuals or ammunition ordered and appointed to manage the said Office by his High the Lord Proprietary or in his absence by his Lieutenant Generall for the time being shall use the utmost of his endeavours according to the best of his skill power and understanding.
