

40. All controversies either between Soldiers and their Captains or other Officers or between Soldier and Soldier relating to their military capacity shall be summarily heard & determined at the next Court Martiall of the Regiment. —
41. In any matter which shall be adjudged in any of the aforesaid Regimentall Courts Martiall either of the parties that shall himselfe aggrieved, may appeal to the Generall Court Martiall who are to take care that if the party appealing make not good his suggestion, recompence be made to the other for the trouble and charge of such an appeal. —
42. In all Criminal causes which concern his Lordship and his Government, his Lordships Advocate Generall, or Judge Advocate of his Lordships Army shall informe the Court and prosector on his Lordships behalfe. —
43. No Officer or Soldier shall presume to hinder the first martiall, his Lieutenant or Servants in the execution of that Office upon paine of death or such other punishment as a Court Martiall shall think fit. But On the contrary all Captaines Officers and Soldiers shall doe their utmost to apprehend and bring to punishment all Offenders, and shall assist the Officers of the Army for that purpose, especially the said first martiall his Lieutenant and Servants, and if the first martiall or his Officers require the assistance of any Officer or Soldier in the apprehending any person declaring to them that it is a capital offence, and the party escape for want of aid and assistance, the party or parties refusing to aide or assist shall suffer such punishment as a Court Marshall shall inflict. —
44. No Officer or Soldier of what quality or degree soever shall at any time presume to offer violence to, or lay any violent hands upon the persons of any Embassadors or other ministers sent out to treat with the Generall or other Comander in Chief of his Lordships forces, touching peace or warre, but that they shall grant and afford to the said Embassadors or other ministers as aforesaid the privilege of safe conduct with free ingress & egress, during the time of such treaty without the least act of hostility to be offered to their persons or the persons of their retinues and attendants under paine of death. —
45. That Officers or Soldiers who shall presume to draw his sword in any place of judicature while the Court is sitting shall suffer such punishment as shall be inflicted on him by a Court Martiall. And his Lordship hereby authorizes the first martiall of his Lordships Army by his owne authority to apprehend such offenders: and if any Soldier being committed for any offence shall break before the said first martiall Generall shall by his owne authority apprehend him & the offendore shall suffer death or such other punishment as the Generall Court
