

- Marshall shall thinke fitt. —
- 46.<sup>o</sup> — If any straggling shall happen within the Camp or place of Garrison, in any of the Soldiers lodgings or where they meet, it shall be enquired into by the Officers of the Regiment, and the Regiment or pursuers thereof punished according to the quality of the Offence. —
- 47.<sup>o</sup> — If any inferior Officer either of horse or foot, be wronged by his Officer, <sup>he may</sup> he complaine to his Colonel, or other Superior Officer of the Regiment, who is to redresse the same upon due proof of the wrong done him; but if he faile therein, the party grieved is to apply himselfe to the Generall Officer for redresse, and if the accusation be false, the Complainant is to be punished at the discretion of a Court Martiall. —
- 48.<sup>o</sup> — If any Colonel or Captaine shall force or take any thing away from any private Soldier that Colonel or Captaine shall be punished according to the quality of the Offence by the judgment of the Generall Court Martiall. But if a Soldier shall be wronged, and shall not appeal to the Court or his Superior Commanders but take his owne Satisfaction for it, he shall be punished by the judgment of a Court Martiall. —
- 49.<sup>o</sup> — If any Soldier dye, no other shall take or spoile his goods upon paine of restoring double the value to him to whom they belong and of such further punishment as a Court Marshall shall thinke fitt, But the Captaine of the Comp<sup>a</sup> of which such a Soldier was, shall take the said goods into his custody and dispose of them for paying his Quarters (if any thing therefore be found due) and to keepe the overplus (if any be) for the use of those to whom they belong, and who shall claime the same within three months after his death, And if any Captaine or Officer dye, the Chiefe Commander shall take care of preserving his estate in like manner. —
- 50.<sup>o</sup> — No Provost Martiall shall refuse to receive or keepe a Prisoner sent to his Charge by authority, or shall discharge him without order upon paine of such punishment as a Court Martiall shall thinke fitt. And if the Officer for which his prisoner was apprehended deserved death, the provost Martiall, ~~refusing~~ refusing to receive and keepe him as aforesaid shall be liable to the same death. —
- 51.<sup>o</sup> — If any person be committed by the provost Martialls owne authority without other Command, he shall acquaint the Generall or other Chiefe Commander with the cause thereof within foure and twenty houres, and the Provost Martiall shall thereupon discharge him, unless he have Order to the contrary. —
