 part thereof at their peccell Given under the great Seale  
 of the said Province of Maryland the Twentieth day of June  
 in the first year of the Dominion of Charles the first  
 An<sup>o</sup> 1636.

At a Council held at Mattapony Thursday July the 6<sup>th</sup>  
 1636. - present.

The Hon<sup>or</sup> { Jesse Wharton Esq<sup>r</sup> Deputy Lt<sup>e</sup> Deputy Governour

Ordered that Gerard Browne and Doctor Maddox be satisfied out of  
 the publique for pasture of Cap<sup>t</sup> Allen's troop of horses so long  
 as they shall be employed about the safety of the King of Mattawomon

Ordered that the twenty horse men to be appointed by Cap<sup>t</sup> Allen to  
 assist the King of Mattawomon receive their Orders from time to time  
 from Cap<sup>t</sup> Appinall to be sent the said Appinall from the Deputy Governour  
 and Council and by the said Appinall to be delivered to the Officer that  
 commands the said horse. And that the said Appinall buy a small boat or  
 skiff enough to passe the Creeke to the Indian Towne upon all Occasions  
 for which he is to be allowed out of the publique.

Cap<sup>t</sup> Allen desiring to know how he should behave himselfe in case  
 he should meet the Seneca or any other Enemy Indians (who what it  
 supposed comes to warre with Our friend Indians) It is resolved  
 that his first attempt and endeavour do make peace between them  
 by all means possible, But if it cannot be done, then according to  
 the agreement that wee have made with Our Own Indians, he is then  
 to give notice to the Deputy Governour, and in case Our friend Indians  
 will send out a sufficient number able to engage the Enemy to joyn  
 with him against the Seneca or any other Enemy, that then he assist  
 them.

At a Council held at Mattapony Friday the seventh day  
 of July 1636. - present ut supra.

Ordered that immediately upon sight hereof All military Officers  
 muster their men under their Command and appoint every man to be in  
 readynesse upon all Occasions at the Deputy Governour and Council  
 shall thinke fitt, and that they be provided each man with ten pounds of  
 biscott and beefe or bawne proportionable, One pound of powder and three  
 pounds of shot. And that the Captaines, Lieutenants, Ensignes & Sergeants  
 within six dayes after give to each person and let that he be provided with  
 ten pounds of biscott. And that the respective Captaines send downe to the  
 Deputy Governour their Muster Rolls.
