Officers according to His Excellency's.

Immediately upon sight hereof you will so prepare your Selfe
so that you appear on Thursday the twenty first instant at St
Maries there to joyne with the Deputy Lieutenant of this
Province and his Lieutenants together with the other Officers
that shall then and thence be present in a Council of War
to advise what shall be fit to be done in Order to the
preservation of the peace of this Province Given under my
hand & seal the 13th day of July in the first year of
the Lord 1636 Dominion & Province 1636. — Jeff Wharton.

Ordered That Edward Jones of St Geromes be allowed Out
of the publicque five hundred pounds of tobacco a month
his finding himselfe a messenger to go upon all messages as the
Deputy Governor & Council shall think fitt, and if extra
ordinary Occasion require that the said Jones be impowered to
impress a horse. —

Ordered that twenty or thirty of Capt Donalls men be appointed
to keep a guard at Matherney for the safety thereof, and be
allowed Out of the publicque. —

It is knowne the great men of Ethiopiae informed the Deputy
Governour and Council the death of their King, and desired the same
unity as formerly with them might be continued & that till they
choose another King they were ruled by their Great Men & Speaker
which was consented to by the Deputy Governor & Council.

Proclamation by the Lord Proprietary.

If or whichever the Province is daily threatened to be invaded
by the Indians, and the inhabitants of this Province lying so
dispersed, and that in many places they are in so small numbers that
they are utterly unable to defend themselves, By the end that the
people may in some reasonable manner be secured and that the
enemy may not gaine too much ground of us. Wee doe by this
advice of Our Deputy Lieutenant and Council Order the In-
habitants of St Maries Talbot Ann Arundell Baltimore
Charles and Dariel countys to infort themselves in their houses
and into the said forts to draw any persons able to bear arms
not exceeding ten men in number Unlesse they be servants greatly
furnished and bona-fide paid for by the master of the house
where such fort shall be. And in regard drawing greater
numbers then ten into any one house will undoubtedly give too
much ground to the enemy upon any invasion that may happen.
Wee doe further with the advice of Our said Deputy & Council
strictly charge and command all masters of ~~houses~~ houses
where such forts shall be, not to entertaine any greater
numbers then ten men able to bear arms into any of their
said forts or houses Upon paine of being proceeded against as
murtherers and seditioners persons gathered together with force
contrary to the knowne Lawes of this Province and the Law of the
Kingdome of England, Unlesse the men now belonging to servants
as aforesaid to the said Masters or now sojourning in the said Provinces
