given or disposed of to any person or persons within any the
severall & especiall Countys within this Province, and
be it further Ordained by the Authority aforesaid, that if
any the said Convicts are already landed sold given or
disposed of to any person or persons within this Province
or shall hereafter be landed sold given or disposed of —
without such bond given as aforesaid, that the next Justice
of the Peace to the place of residence of any the said Convicts
or of the person to whom the said Convicts shall be sold —
given or disposed of shall forthwith send for such Convict(s)
person or persons, & them to Prison shall committ until the
Master of the Shipp in which they were transported or
the fact or facts to whom the said Convict(s) shall happen
to be consigned, or the person or persons to whom the said
Convict(s) shall happen to be sold given or otherwise disposed
of shall enter into like Bond of fifty pounds Sterling to
such said Master with condition for the good behaviour of
the said Convict(s) during their stay on board within
this Province.
