the Denial signed by the Governor & sealed with the great seal of this  
Province the Instructions also signed by the Governor & sealed with  
his Royal Letter Seal at Annes & are both copied as following.

Thomas West Esq<sup>r</sup> Lieutenant and High Governor of the Province  
of Maryland under the R<sup>t</sup> Hon<sup>r</sup> Charles Algernon Lord Proprietary of  
the Province of Maryland & Annes Lord Baron of Baltimore &c.  
To all to whom these presents shall come or may way to appertaine —  
Greeting in Our Lord God everlasting Whereas the Sugnefathamonghs  
Cimigys & divers other nations of Indians inhabiting to the  
Norward of this Province, have formerly committed divers  
Unjust & other Outrages within this Province Upon which  
there hath ensued a Warre betwene his Majestys Subjects  
resident within this Province under the Government of his  
Said Majestys as well as with those residing under the Government of  
his Sacred Majes<sup>r</sup> Colony of Virginia, & the said Sugnefathamonghs  
=Prinoughs. And whereas the said Sugnefathamonghs have  
Sithence and lately desired to come to a treaty of peace —  
with his said Lordships, and have (as I am informed) since the  
said Overture submitted themselves to and putt themselves und  
the protection of the Cimigys or some other nation of  
Indians residing to the Northward of this Province, & within  
or near unto the Territories of his Highness the Duke of  
Yorke Know ye that I have constituted Ordained appointed  
and authorized as I do hereby constitute, ordaine appoint  
certaine Henry Donyng Esq<sup>r</sup> Vice of his Royal Council  
for this Province as Embassador or Envoy to treat with  
e conclude a firme Peace with the said Sugnefathamonghs  
Cimigys or any other Indians now unknowne to us inhabiting  
or residing to the Northward of us within or without the  
Territories of his said Royall Highness, and from whom we  
have already received injury or may hereafter reasonably  
suspect we may receive injury by the confederacy between  
them and the said Sugnefathamonghs upon such reasonable  
terms as to him shall seeme meet & convenient according to  
his instructions; And whereasmuch as the said Indians doe  
now reside for the most part within the Territory of his  
Said Royall Highness, what least cannot be treated with but  
by a journey to be had through his said Highnesses Territory  
I doe hereby constitute Ordaine appoint & authorize the said  
Henry Donyng to treat with Edmund Andros Esq<sup>r</sup> Signeur  
of Sayford Lieutenant & Governor Generall under his  
Royall Highness the James Duke of Yorke & Albany &c of all  
his Territories in America, and to desire leave to passe through  
the said Territory under his protection to the treaty with the  
Indians aforesaid, and to request his assistance in the concluding  
of a firme peace for all his Majes<sup>r</sup> Subjects in his Ma<sup>r</sup>ts  
Colony of Virginia as well as for those of this Province  
with the Indians aforesaid Wherefore I doe request that  
the aforesaid Henry Donyng (according to the law of Nations)
