When you have fully informed your selfe of the State of
affairs where you are designed, and of the manner of treating
with the Indians, if you shall find the aforesaid instructions
deficient in any point which may be necessary for you in the
execution of your Commission, you and thence use the utmost of
your Care & Endeavour to let us may be most safe the service
of his Lordships and the good and Safety of this Province according
to the best of your judgment & discretion to which in full
causes I wholly referre you.

Whereas the Governour & Councill are informed
that there are severall persons that are seated
within this Province on the Seaboard side & do
pretend to be under the Government of New-York
It is therefore ordered that a speciall Warrant
be granted to M^r W^m Stevens for eight thousand
acres of land to be proportioned out by him for the
encouragement of such as will seat there on the said
Seaboard side, & that such persons as seat there shall
have seven years liberty to make good right for
the said land, paying to his Lord^{ss} only the sum
of two shillings sterl yearly for every hundred
acres And further it is Ordained that those
that seat nearest the Hoarkills shall have out of
the said eight thousand acres one thousand acre
of land for a family, having in it three work-
