

They sing a song after their manner, being their method of a new covenant made, which they doe undertake to hold firm, bee on the first tymeth they have seen any authorized from Maryland & Virginia, & say farther, we are glad & do welcome his honour the Colonele with a better & a drest Elffkin, for his trouble in making so farre a journey.

5<sup>th</sup> May

They doe sing another song, the meaning whereof is, that their people might not forget what is past betwixt them & the Colonele, but might be alwayes mindfull of what is done in this house ordained so that and by the Governo. generald if the Sinner for now or any tyme hereafter shalld appoint any other place for to speake with you in their own Country or elsewhere, we desire that it may not be accepted, but that it be remaine the only appointed & spicid place and all that was propounded by you the fourth of this instant, we desire that it may be punctually obserued upon your side, as we shall upon ours and if you haue a minde hereafter to speake with us, we desire that it may be here & nowhere else doe present adrest Elffkin.

6<sup>th</sup> May

They say, we doe return you heartly thankes for the releasing of the two Sonnes of Canondondaed & the chiefe Sachim of the Maquas & likewise that you beheaded the Sachim of the Susquehannock named Arhine & Sarhaweg who was the cause of their being taken Prisoners, & doe present five Beavers.
