 Wher we have allwayes had a firm Covenant with
 this Governm^t which hath been faithfully kept by the
 Governour gon^l whom we have taken to be our
 greatest Lord, for which we doe give him hearty thank
 for he hath putt aside all mistakes which have hap-
 -pened, we never had wars with this Government
 but with yours, & now you are come from Maryland &
 Virginia to speak with us in his p^rson. And lett that
 which you have proposed to us be as fast & firm as the
 Covenant we have with the Governour gon^l we
 humbly thank you that you have sent for us to speak
 with us in this Governm^t & doe p^rsent halfe a beaver
 You are come here to speak with us of good things, & we
 will give you a good answer therupon, doe give one
 beaver.

 We thank you that you doe bury & forgett all former
 disfrontments & injuries, as we doe the same, & never
 more to be remembered; for we know very well our
 people have been offensive unto you, we desire and
 recommend unto you the continuation of the Covenant
 now made betwixt us, as that which we have with the
 Governour gon^l doe give one beaver.

4th dy
 In case any of yo^r Indians doe any hostility to us, we
 shall acquaint you therewith, before we take up the
 ar against them and we desire the like of you and
 the reason that we plundered the English there, was
 their entertaining of those Indians that were our
 Enemies
