

Gerard & Justinian Gerard in the sum of fifty thousand  
 pounds of Tobacco agreed that the said Thomas Freeman  
 be of good abearance as well towards his Lordship as all  
 the good people of this Province during his naturall life  
 or at least his stay in this Province you are therefore  
 hereby Impowred to enter the said order of his Lordship  
 upon Record And God hereby declares on the behalfe of  
 his Lordship the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> of this Province  
 the aforesaid Recognizances to be void and null to all intents  
 & purposes whatsoever And for your satisfaction this shall  
 be your sufficient Warrant given under my hand the  
 sixteenth day of October in the third year of his Lordship  
 Dominion &c Annoq<sup>ue</sup> Domini 1678

Articles of peace and amity concluded & agreed upon  
 between the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> Charles Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> of this  
 Province &c And Unnacohasimon Emper<sup>or</sup> of Manticoke  
 the 28<sup>th</sup> of March 1678

Imprimis

It is agreed upon that from this Day forward there be an  
 Inviolable peace & amity between the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord  
 Prop<sup>ty</sup> of this Province & the Emper<sup>or</sup> of Manticoke upon  
 the articles hereafter in this treaty to be agreed upon to  
 the world end to endure & that all former acts of hostility &  
 Damages whatsoever by either party sustained be buried  
 in perpetuall oblivion

That the said Emper<sup>or</sup> of Manticoke shall deliver up all  
 Indians that shall come into his Dominion that are or  
 shall be Enemies to the English and further that if any  
 Indian subject to the said Emper<sup>or</sup> shall hereafter kill  
 an English man that the said Emper<sup>or</sup> shall be obliged to  
 deliver such Indian up to the Govern<sup>or</sup> of this Province  
 as a prisoner
