

That the said Emperor shall not make any new peace with
our Enemy, nor shall make any War without the Consent
of the Right Hon^{ble} the Lord Prop^{ty} for the time being —

8^{thly} In case the said Unnacohasimmon or any Indian
subject to him shall kill Ababeo or any of his Indians or
any other in peace and amity with the said Lord Prop^{ty}
shall be esteemed as great an offence as killing an
English man —

9^{thly} That in case any Indian or Indians of any other nation
or nations that shall come within his Dominion or
Territory & shall by him or other Indians under him
be entertained and that any of them the said Indians
shall kill any English or kill or destroy any hogs, Cattle or
horses or shall break up any English mans house &
steal his or their goods that he the said Unnacohasimmon
shall be responsible for the same & in case hereafter
he shall have knowledge of any other murder or
killed David Williams & his family that he shall be
bound by engaged to deliver them up to M^r. Thomas Walker
or any next magistrate to be by them conveyed to the
Gouverno^r. as soon as found —

That Unnacohasimmon shall pay yearly to the use of the
Lord Prop^{ty} four Indian arrows every year on the 20th
day of October to M^r. Charles Hutchins as an acknowledgment
to his Lordship and as a token of the continuance of the
Peace —
