Resolved at our said Ordinance that the said General Assembly be
prorogued until the last Tuesday in September next ensuing the
date hereof And we do hereby will and require as also strictly charge
and Comaund all and singular the Sheriffs of this Our Province
forwith upon receipt hereof to make Publick Proclamacion hereof in the most
Publick and convenient places within their Respective Counties And to give
notice to all and singular the Delegates and Deputies by the Freedom
of their County already elected or for that purpose to be elected that (all excuses
set a part) they and every of the said Delegates come and personally
appear at the said City of Saint Marys on the said last Tuesday in
September next ensuing to doo and Consul to those things which therein
and hereby the favour of God shall happen to be Ordained by us by
and with the advice and Consul of Our great Councill of this Our
Province concerning the State and welfare of this Our Province. It
also to give notice to such of our Councill as shall be within their
Respective Counties that (all excuses set a part) they also doo and
appear at the said day and place aforesaid to the end and purpose
aforesaid Given at Our City of Saint Marys Under the Great Seal
of our said Province of Maryland the fourteenth day of March in
the fourth year of our Dominion of Charles the first 1670.

A Proclamation

Whereas we are given to understand that there is a tract of Land lying
in Somerset County called Albion on the North side of
Coromocke River, whereon a great number of Indians doe live, also
that there is a tract of Land called Annapoquan containing about three
thousand Acres lying on the South side of Coromocke River in the County
aforesaid whereon Indians are seated. And other tracts of Land called
Carahogon containing about two thousand Acres whereon is built
a small Indian Towne by a brooke of Coromocke River that
runneth out of the North side of the said River And that there
are severall Indians seated in ~~and~~ a tract of Land lying on the
South side of Wiroromoro in Somerset County aforesaid called Smodokade
which part of four Mannes. And also that there is a tract of Land of a
considerable quantity of acres whereon Indians are seated lying on the
North side of Wiroromoro River by a brooke called Cuthinghams
Brooke. Also that there is a tract of Land called Turbando which
