 the said Thomas Burroy giving security by bills of Exchange and
 also good security for the payment of such bills of Exchange as he shall
 draw or good sufficient moneys bills of this Province for the due
 payment of all such wages as are due unto the Seaman for
 navigating the said Ship

These are to License Robert Ridgely of St. Maryes

 in Somerset County to trade with any Indian or
 Indians whatsoever for any Cowe Skins or
 other Commodities not prohibited by Act of
 Assembly And further to give the said
 Robert liberty of keeping an Indian or
 Indians to hunt for him upon his said
 Plantation in Somerset County aforesaid And
 for so doing this shall be his sufficient
 warrant Given under my hand & Seal at
 Annes this twelfth day of July in the fourth
 year of our Dominion over our said Province
 of Maryland And in the year of our Lord
 God 1679
