to less than the greatest Quantities of Indian corn and wheat & so forth as other
sorts of grain. Most likely to have been made within this Province this —
present year; whereby the inhabitants of this Province might in all
probability have supplied themselves and other our Neighbouring
Colonies and plantations, had their faire hope and expectations of
a plentiful crop succeeded; but contrarily the same hath been so —
farreall and generall a disappointment that the aforementioned sorts
of graine vizt Indian Corn and wheat are already become very
scarce within this Province, insomuch that it is now feared the
same will scarcely supply the common necessities of the Inhabitants
of this Province Sufficiently for themselves and familyes as from
the general Rumor and report from all parts of this Province
it is now heard and received; We have therefore thought fit
and do by and with the advice and counsel of our Council thereby
strictly prohibite and forbid all and singular the Inhabitants of this
our Province upon any pretence whatsoever, to sell or otherwise —
despose off to any Merchant or Master of shipp or Vessele or other
than whatsover any Indian Corn or wheat of any Quantity —
whatsoever, to be exported out of this Province to any other port or
place whatsoever, as they will answer & contrary at their perill by
incurring our displeasure, and the heavy consequences thereof if they
for any order warrant or license to the contrary thereof in any wise
notwithstanding therby also willing and requiring all Merchants and
Masters of Ships & Vesseles and other persons whatsoever trading
into inhabiting or abiding within this Province to putt due cognizance
thereof, so as no shipper take receive or putt on board any shipp
or Vessele whatsoever to export out of this Province any the aforesaid
graine of Indian Corn or wheat as they will answer the contrary
at their perill as aforesaid And we do by and with the advice and
counsel of our Council strictly charge and command all and singular our
Officers civil and Military within this Province, and others the good
people thereof to make diligent search and inquiry in and about their
several and respective precincts and habitations concerning the breach
hereof to the end that the offendes therein may be proceeded against as shall
by us be thought fit according to Law. We willing also commanding all
singular Officers of this our Province by themselves or D. by forthwith
to make publick proclamation thereof in most publick and convenient
places within their respective bounds for the information of all
the Inhabitants of our said Province, and others therin concerned,
to the end that none offending against the same may plead ignorance.
