 betters or words to that effect, the said Carville answered that my Lord
 putt none in Office but knaves and fools, and that he had made three
 or four Sheriffs, naming this Dep^t Major Cayton, some of Cold
 Burgis's Son, who were knaves and fools, for he putt none of into
 Office, some of the Company replied that his Dep^t had a kindness for this
 Dep^t the said Carville replied it was because he this Dep^t chate the
 Countrey; this Dep^t answered that the said Carville might say what he
 pleased, being in this Dep^t house, but desired M^r Pitt and M^r Bowling
 to inquire how the said Carville had abused his Dep^t, for that he
