have ~~concerning~~ meet them and disc<sup>c</sup> what further they had to say  
But in case the said Indians should seem to tempt or be  
further inquisit<sup>i</sup> of the cause of our sending for them  
It was then ordered that Mayo<sup>d</sup> Boardman should acquaint  
them ~~concerning~~ with the mord<sup>d</sup> committ<sup>d</sup> and give them to understand  
that whereas they have had som<sup>m</sup> men lately killed and w<sup>r</sup>  
likewise som<sup>m</sup> others the Govrno<sup>d</sup> and Council thought it  
necess<sup>y</sup> for our common preservation to hold a Matchacomico  
of Ours and them great m<sup>t</sup> together to consult & advise  
upon some Expid<sup>i</sup>on to be taken for our Defence  
against invasion & assault of foreign Indians.

On a Council held at Manahowick Neck y<sup>e</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> of Aug<sup>ust</sup> 78.

Ordered that a S<sup>t</sup> L<sup>t</sup> b<sup>r</sup> in this Ord<sup>r</sup> Prop<sup>r</sup> of Gov<sup>r</sup> advising  
his L<sup>t</sup> pp<sup>r</sup> of the late mord<sup>d</sup> and the result of the Council  
thereon w<sup>r</sup> was accordingly done as fol<sup>r</sup> vs.

Maryland Aug<sup>ust</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> 1678:

May it please yo<sup>r</sup> L<sup>t</sup> pp<sup>r</sup>:

Having the Opportunity of Gov<sup>r</sup>l D<sup>r</sup> park<sup>r</sup> from Maryland with  
aw<sup>r</sup> th<sup>e</sup> d<sup>r</sup> thought it our duty to the same to acquaint yo<sup>r</sup> L<sup>t</sup> pp<sup>r</sup> with  
a mord<sup>d</sup> lately (to say on y<sup>e</sup> third instant in th<sup>e</sup> morning) committ<sup>d</sup> on  
Dan<sup>i</sup>l Cunningham & his family near the head of Potowm<sup>n</sup> River  
Som<sup>m</sup> Indians strongly presum<sup>d</sup> to be th<sup>e</sup> Sasattaway<sup>s</sup>, the said  
Cunningham and another young man killed outright as they were in th<sup>e</sup>  
field at Work Cunningham w<sup>r</sup> S<sup>t</sup> Tomosko add in th<sup>e</sup> house where  
she was afterward found lying prostrate in h<sup>e</sup> blood & not quite dead  
but rend<sup>d</sup> allogther sp<sup>r</sup> ch<sup>r</sup> & so remained till her death w<sup>r</sup> happened  
yesterday morning so that though she were a person well knowing and  
acquainted with most of thos<sup>m</sup> Indians she could not declare any thing, but  
by signs w<sup>r</sup> sh<sup>e</sup> mad<sup>d</sup> did plainly discover the murderers to be Sasattaway<sup>s</sup>  
for being alld how many Indians had bin th<sup>e</sup> she held up her hand with  
her thumb downe thereby (to say by her four fingers held up) intimating four  
being bin alld whether Wapitaw<sup>s</sup> (a Sasattaway Indian known<sup>d</sup> to be  
thos<sup>m</sup> parts and whom th<sup>e</sup> Capt<sup>r</sup> suspected guilty of th<sup>e</sup> Mord<sup>d</sup>) w<sup>r</sup>  
th<sup>e</sup> th<sup>e</sup> immediately lift up h<sup>r</sup> hand to her head where she was wounded from  
whence and s<sup>r</sup> v<sup>r</sup> all other circumstances concurring w<sup>r</sup> gather and are fully  
swad<sup>d</sup> that th<sup>e</sup> Sasattaway Indians are the real mord<sup>d</sup>rs. Whereupon
