When mett According to appointm^t of Council held at y^e
same place the 10th instant, the great men of Pascatoway
being also appointed to meet there the Day whereupon the
Council consult and advise what necessary to be said to them
when they come, and it is resolved that they be given to understand

That whereas a few daies since the Empero^r and one other of their
great men had been with the Governo^r and informed him of some of their
Indians being lately killed (as they did believe) of some of the Shimiquo &
Sugyahamoh Indians, and did then offer to y^e Governo^r severall presents
of monie to w^{ch} he did then give no positive answer, butted assured
them that he would send to Fort Albany and avouring to speak with the
great men of the Shimiquos to know of them what their designe was
whether they resolved to hold the same Articles with us (amongst w^{ch} one was
that they should hold peace with the Pascatoway) & to continue their
League here soe we may hold peace with the Pascatoway, soe long as they
are willing and doe actually keep the Peace made with us. The Council
doe readily concur with the Governo^r therein and doe confirm and approve
what is hath done, that Intelligence is daily expected from Albany, w^{ch}
when we receive shall give them notice, but till then can give them
no further answer as to that particular.

The next thing to be offered to them being a matter of
great consequence was.

That w^{ch} we have heard of (so say) a man a woman & a youth lately
killed at a Plantation about y^e head of Potuxon River, the man and
the youth killed outright, but the woman who lived severall daies
after shee before her death Declared that one Wasttaps (a Pascatoway
