Received yesterday from Col. Wall Dated the 23rd instant and another from Col. Taylor Dated the 26th instant relating to another barbarous murder committed the 19th instant by some Indians on three English men on the East Side of Susquehanna River as they lay a bridge in the River Side, read and taken into consideration.

Ordered that for special Court County Command in chief of all his Majesty's foot militia in Cecil and Kent Counties be advised of the same, and that special care be taken of the frontiers and his Command that the said Murder be reported to his next General Assembly for their further consideration, that in the mean time Jacob Young or some other person or persons be employed to make inquiry into the same and if possible to discover the murderers and send an Account thereof to his Government with all expedition, And that a Letter be written to Col. Courney to that effect.

Which was Done and is as followeth viz

Col. Henry Courney

Having lately met two or three severall times at my Governour house about a murder lately committed at the head of Potomac River w^{ch} from severall circumstances relating therunto seeme to bear an ill aspect, we have fully concluded to call an Assembly at the City of St. Maris on the Twentieth Day of October next, and have accordingly issued forth Proclamation to the severall Counties with writts for the electing of New Delegates in the room of those that were in the last Assembly are deceased, and first you will not fail to come into my upper house at the same time. Yesterday we recd. a Letter Dated the 23rd instant from Col. Wall and another from Col. Taylor of the 26th instant touching another murder committed the 19th instant in Cecil County on the East Side of Susquehanna River. Wherefore we think it absolutely necessary and desire you to take all care imaginable to guard your frontiers by such waies and means as you in your Discretion shall think most requisite for the Security of those parts from any further Assaults, And that in the mean time you employ Jacob Young and such others as you shall think fit to make inquiry into the said Murder, An Account whereof you soone as they can make any Discoverie that they render to the Governour with all speed. You are likewise requested to send forward the inclosed to Capt. Liberty in Cecil County, and the other to Col. Low. your Sheriff lett be directed with all expedition the other Packet please to send by a safe hand to Capt. Taylor in Dorchester County it requiring also great haste to come in time for the electing of Burgesses for the Assembly, in all w^{ch} we doubt not of your care in the last, and have not further to add but our respects to you Wth rest
