attendance. That then his Lordship will please to let y^e Empero.
and great men know that he hath sent for them on purpose to let
them speak with him according to his Message sent them of Cape
Prudent, & to ~~let~~ ^{put} them ^{in mind} know that when his Lordship departed this
Province they gave him great assurance of their friendship to himself
and the people of the Province that they had also y^e same assurance
from him in behalf of himself and y^e English and his Govern. that
now he was heartily glad to see them, and standing by his Govern. and
Council that they were desirous to speak with him in relation to a
late Encounter betwixt them and y^e Susquehannons, & that they had
something to propound to his L^{ty} for their own security against
Foreign Indians, that he was now ready to receive their propositions
would consider of them & give them a good answer.
That a further said Conference with y^e said Indians his L^{ty} will then
be in a better condition to take his just measures in relation to y^e said
Murders w^{ch} at y^e next meeting of y^e Council his L^{ty} may conclude on.

Articles of Peace and Amity concluded & agreed upon betwixt
the Rt Hon^{ble} Charles Lord Baltimor: Lord Prop: of the Province &c.
and the Empero. of Abatagu, the Kings of Pokomok, Jmgotragu,
Nuswattap, Anamisp, Acquentica, Morumno & for all the
Indians and their Subjection this 13th Day of Decemb: 1678.

It is agreed that from this Day forward there be an inviolable peace & Amity
betwixt y^e Rt Hon^{ble} Lord Prop: of the Province & y^e Empero. of Abatagu,
the Kings of Pokomok, Jmgotragu, Nuswattap, Anamisp, Acquentica,
Morumno, and for all the Indians and their Subjection, upon the Articles
hereafter in this Treaty to be agreed upon to the world End to endure, and that
all former Acts of hostility and Damages for either party sustained to be
buried in spiritual Oblivion.

That y^e said Empero. of Abatagu, and the Kings before mentioned shall
deliver up all Indians that shall come into his or their Dominions that are
or shall be Enemies to the English, and further that if any Indian Subject
to the said Empero. and Kings before specified shall hereafter kill any
English man, that the said Empero. and Kings aforesaid shall be obliged
to deliver such Indian up to the Govern. of the Province as a Prisoner.

Forasmuch as the English cannot easily distinguish one Indian from
another, that no Indian shall come into any English Plantation, pasture,
and that all Indians shall be bound to call aloud, before they come within 300 paces
of any English mans clear ground play down their Armes, whether Guns, Bows
or Arrows or other Weapon for any English man that shall appear upon
his call to take up, and in case no one appear, that he thereto shall leave his
said Armes if he come nearer, and that a forward by calling aloud endure.
