

Was then proposed by his L^{ty} to y^e Council whether it might not
 be convenient to apprehend Araraut and Manahawton, two Indians
 guilty of the murder committed at y^e head of Pottopon River (as by severall
 Indian evidences both substantiall circumstances relating therunto
 it had appeared) especially they being none of the great men neither
 were they sent for, and therfor cause nor und^r colour of y^e publick
 faith

Which being putt to y^e vote it was carried in y^e affirmative and it is
 resolved that the Emperors great men together with Araraut & Manahawton
 be sent for in altogether, and that his L^{ty} should treat with them according
 to the result of the Council at y^e last meeting, And that in fine his L^{ty}
 plainly tell them, that he was sufficiently sensible of y^e murder com-
 mitted on Daniel Comingham and his family at y^e head of Pottopon
 River in Aug: last, as also of the persons that committed it whom he
 now saw before his face, and therfor his L^{ty} did not doubt but
 they would deliver them up according to their Articles, if they expected
 to be protected by him, which if they should deny or refuse to do
 it was the opinion of y^e Council that his L^{ty} might justly cause
 them to be secured.

The Chancero is desired to read to y^e Interpreter Major Boarman y^e severall
 particulars of y^e Councils result in ord^r to the conference the last meeting
 w^{ch} y^e Interpreter accordingly delivers to y^e Indians with w^{ch} they seeme
 to be very well satisfied, And make their Request to his L^{ty} for a
 supply of Amunition great part of their Amunition being taken
 in a late encounter betwixt them and the Semiquos and Tusq: the
 Interpreter being ord^red to ask them what quantity they had occasion for
 they made answer that they referred that to his L^{ty}. So w^{ch} his L^{ty}
 was pleased by his Interpreter to let them know that according to his
 League made with them he always was & still is ready to assist them upon
 all occasions both for their own support and against their Enemies, w^{ch}
 as his L^{ty} had assured them of so he expected the like reciprocal friendship
 from them towards his L^{ty} and the English und^r his Governmt.

To w^{ch} they answer that they do confess and acknowledge his L^{ty} has truly
 provided his League with them and kept y^e Articles, And that for themselves
 they know none but the Tusq: that had broken them.

The Chancero hath in charge from his L^{ty} by the Interpreter to tell them that
 the Lord Prop^r had sent for them to see them and had heard what they had
 to say, but now he thought fit to say something to them (w^{ch} is) that his
 L^{ty} and the People of the Province und^r his Governmt. have always firmly
 observed and kept the peace with them, but w^{ch} know some of their Indians
 have not kept the peace with him, there was Comingham his Wife and her Bro:
 killed at y^e head of Pottopon, w^{ch} certainly know who killed them, And My
