Whereunto the Speaker Reply'd. that there was another Indian at y<sup>e</sup> Pascatoway flocks w<sup>ch</sup> was taken prisoner and had lately mad: his escap: from those two midd: Town: of y<sup>e</sup> Simiquos with whom y<sup>e</sup> Tusq. liv'd who was ord: d within three Day: to be putt to the fire: w<sup>ch</sup> he mad: him adventure: his life: in flight rather than stay there: to be burnt, the said Indian do's Relat

That y<sup>e</sup> Great man of the Tusq. mad: a speech to this effect that he was pretty well satisfied with y<sup>e</sup> Revenge: he had taken of y<sup>e</sup> Virginia: and by y<sup>e</sup> help and assistance: of those Indians And now did intend to fall upon y<sup>e</sup> Pascatoway Indians and the English in Maryland for that he had don: little or nothing there: yett but resolv'd now to do: what mischief: he could to them, that a considerable ffly of them w<sup>er</sup>: gon: forth 6. for: y<sup>e</sup> said Indian mad: his escap: w<sup>ch</sup> was about 20 Day: since.

Then Quirid What flocks those two flocks might consist of

Ans: so: strong they could not express it.

The said Great man of y<sup>e</sup> Tusq. likewise Declar'd that he would never have any peace with y<sup>e</sup> English, or y<sup>e</sup> Pascatoway, Choptico, or any other Indians whatsoever on y<sup>e</sup> South Sid: of Potapsco to whom he will never cease to do: all y<sup>e</sup> mischief: he can, but for those only other Sid: of Potapsco they have no prejudice ag<sup>t</sup>: them having never receiv'd any injury: from them and therefore know no: reason they have to meddle with them. He likewise further did Declar: that they had lately killed some English in Maryland but y<sup>e</sup> English had laid it upon y<sup>e</sup> Pascatoway Indians.

Quirid of that Indian that cam: from y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid four Townes of the Simiquos & intend: thither back again whether he resolv'd to live there or not.

Ans: that he had receiv'd so: much civility & kindness from them that he did long to f<sup>o</sup>: them as much as his own: friends & acquaintanc:, but would return: back again in two year: time unless they should find him upon some Mt: so: soon: (whereof he at present knew nothing) otherwise he intend: to stay among them so: long. but then resolv'd to come back
