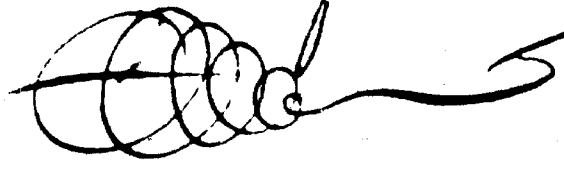


Request and Supplication of the said Indians Do. h. by fully acquit

At a Council held at Manahowick's Neck in Wicocomico River the
Eight and twentieth Day of April in the fourth year of the Dominion of
His Hon. Charles Jr. over this Province Among Dni 1679:

Where Cap. Francis Parke Comand. of the Shipp Merchants Court of Lond. being
summoned to give in his Evidence concerning some fraudulent papers that
had been uttered by Cap. Josias Standall of Charles County, himself, and
others touching the Shipp was Examined upon oath and Deposed as
follows

That about the latter End of the month of February last he the Depont
together with Mr. William Parrott being at the house of Cap. Josias Standall
in Charles County he the Depont heard the said Standall say that he had been
much troubled, and had greatly suffered in his Estate that now the said
time was coming that he might have an opportunity to right himself
then they fell into discourse concerning the late report of the troubles in
England, and the said Standall inquired of the Depont concerning a
Shipp that was to be sent from England hither and the Depont replied
that he heard such a report upon his coming away from England that
there lay a Shipp ready but did not hear that it was yet arrived
here that the intent of his coming was for the Lord Baltimore, Gov.
The said Standall made answer, what need had they to find a Shipp hither
for (if it be true as is reported of the troubles in England) I will engage
(if they will but find two or three words to me) to find him from
my self, and so they may save that charge.

The said Parke was then required to make his further appearance at the
Council Board to morrow morning nine a Clock according to the
Maryland.

You are hereby stricly charged and Comanded all excuses left
apart to be and personally appear before his Highness the Lord
Prop. and his Council at Manahowick's Neck to morrow morning
by nine of the Clock precisely to answer unto such matters & things
as shall be then and there proposed to you on behalf of the said
Highness the Lord Prop., whereof you are not to fail, or if will answer
the contrary as you shall see the eighth Day of April
Amo 1679.
