Whereas this Day warrant issued from und^r hand of y^e Hon^{ble} William Calvert Esq^r to summon Cap^t Josias Fendall of Charles County to be and officionally appear before his L^{ty} the Lord Prop^r & his Council at Manahowick Neck this Day to answer unto such matters or things as should then and there be objected against him on behalf of his said L^{ty} w^{ch} said warrant was sent by Ralph Smith to be served in manner aforesaid, And forasmuch as the said Ralph Smith did return again without executing y^e said by reason y^e said Fendall was not to be found, And his said L^{ty} and his Council having just cause both by y^e information of y^e said Smith, and for severall other reasons to suspect that the said Fendall conscious to himself of the matters aforesaid against him doth willfully abscond himself. It is therefore will require y^e Cap^t Governor High^{ty} and such others as you shall think fit to take with you for y^e necessary aid and assistance to go forthwith to y^e house of the said Fendall, and him there or else where in y^e said County where he shall be found forthwith to apprehend and cause to be brought before his L^{ty} and his Council at Manahowick Neck this Day here by willing and requiring all and singular the Inhabitants of this Province, and others trading or residing here to be aiding and assisting to you to y^e utmost of their powers in the due Execution of this precept, Under pain of n^oth^{ing} y^e nor they are to fail as y^e will answer y^e contrary at y^e speciall Command of y^e 29th Day of Apr^{il} A. 1639.

 that he heard Cap^t Josias Fendall say that he had bin a great sufferer by y^e Indians, that he had bin much abused & killed Downe a long time, that now y^e time was come and he would right himself for that y^e time was now difficult and trouble some and he should find Disaffected persons enough at y^e L^{ty} & y^e Capt^{ns} shore that would stand by him, and upon some other Discourse that they had concerning Friggatts that were coming in for the Lord Baltimore's Fendall replied what need that, if he had but two or three L^{ms} out of England he would secure him & find him home without y^e charge of Friggatts, all w^{ch} y^e Fendall publicly uttered saying he cared not who heard him.
